About the T-T-T course:

The information presented in this course will review cultural issues among the hearing loss community, identify the most effective approaches to getting emergency responders involved in the course, define characteristics of adult learners, state the course goal and summarize major module objectives and understand a variety of techniques required in obtaining and working with interpreters, Communication Access Realtime Translation (CART), deaf-blind participants and assistive listening systems. Topics include:

- Instructional methods
- Teaching people who are deaf, deaf-blind, late-deafened and hard of hearing
- Teaching emergency responders
- Accommodations and room set-up

Criteria for Emergency Responder Participants: Must have taken "Emergency Responder and the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Community: Taking the First Steps to Disaster Preparedness" course, have at least five years experience in the emergency response and management community and have at least three years experience as a trainer in a professional capacity

Criteria for Consumers (deaf, hard of hearing, late-deafened and deafblind individuals affiliated with an organization or agency): Must have taken "Emergency Responder and the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Community: Taking the First Steps to Disaster Preparedness" course, have at least five years experience serving the consumer community and at least three years experience as a trainer in a professional capacity
